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

Come on cats, take this journey with me. Looks like the old sun in the sky says it's time for me to begin my groovy mission. But before I begin, I need to talk things over one more time with The Man upstairs.



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Scene 1 CD: 3

Elijah: Ah, Israel, what a hoppin' place. The land of the

coolest kings that ever ruled...King David and King Solomon. And here I am, Elijah ready to rock and roll these people for God. How wonderful my life is to bring messages from the good Lord to His people! I guess there's no time like the present, so I guess I'll just get in the groove right now and get down to business! Okay, here goes nothin'. Israelites! Israelites! Gather round! (Elijah moves to stand on a box center stage. The choir gathers around Elijah.)

Townsperson 1: Look dear, some marketplace entertainment. Let's

stop and listen.

Townsperson 2: Great idea. Then, I can rest my head from carrying

this vase of water.

Elijah Hey you cool cats and groovy chicks! Gather around.

I'm Elijah, a prophet of God sent here to rattle your

cage and rescue you from nowheresville.

Townsperson 3: Oh, dear, just another one of those radicals ready to

stir up trouble. (To Elijah) I'm sorry we do not allow

door to door salesmen in our neighborhood.

Townsperson 4: Yes, I already gave at the office.

Elijah: No, you dudes have it all wrong. I'm Elijah, a prophet

of God. I was sent here to help you turn from your evil ways. You all are cruising down the road to disaster!

Townsperson 1: (sarcastically) Disaster? Evil ways? Us?

Townsperson 2: Oh, you must be mistaken. No way!

Elijah: Uh, yes "way." I hear from good authority that you're

"all mixed up." When King David and Solomon was around, you kept your act together and were keepin' it cool by stayin' faithful to the Lord. Now, I've heard that you all are worshipping false idols, one of them named Baal. I'm here to duke it out with those Baal believers and show you wayward Israelites the way.

Townsperson 3: Oh, we still believe in God, but we're equal

opportunity believers. We ALSO believe in Baal.

Elijah: Don't you dudes know that Baal is a false god.

Man, you all are just worshipping a piece of iron.

The Lord Almighty is the only true God.

Townsperson 4: Well, the queen, Jezebel wants us to worship Baal.

Townsperson 1: And we want to keep her happy.

Townsperson 2: Cause when she's happy King Ahab is happy

Townsperson 3 ...and when King Ahab is happy we're are happy...

Townsperson 4 and we stay out of prison and we're not killed...you

get the picture?

Elijah: (holds hands up) Whoa, dude...I totally get the

picture. But, what you're doing is massively wrong. You should only worry about making God happy...no one else. And Baal, when you worship him you are worshipping a pile of nothing. He's not real. Come on,

you have to turn from your evil ways.

Townsperson 1: We hear you. We're just mixed up, Elijah.

Elijah: Dude, this is going to be more difficult than I thought.

Okay, Maybe I need to do this another way...

Scene 2 CD: 5

Townsperson 1: Man, we're hearin' ya. We ARE following the Lord.

Townsperson 2: We're just worshipping Baal, too.

Townsperson 3: Haven't you ever heard of muti-tasking.

Townsperson 4: Sure aren't two gods better than one?

Elijah: Now, let me make myself perfectly clear...there

is only one true God...only one. You cats have to get your act together. The Lord is not happy with you.

Townsperson 1: Well, there's still the problem with King Ahab and

Queen Jezebel. We have to do what they say.

Townsperson 2: Yeah, once the queen tried to have all the prophets of

the Almighty God killed.

Townsperson 3: Thankfully, most of them escaped.

Townsperson 4: She even had Naboth killed to give his garden to King

Ahab.

Elijah: Looks like I need to deal with this hound dog, King

Ahab. It seems he is sinnin' all the time.

Townsperson 1: Elijah, you do NOT know want to go against the king.

Townsperson 2: She's right, you do not want to deal with King Ahab.

Townsperson 3: He's one of the most wicked kings that has ever ruled

Israel.

Townsperson 4: And even worse than King Ahab is his wife, Jezebel.

Whatever she says goes. You better stay away from

them, Elijah. They are bad news.

Elijah: Hey, I'm not afraid of that fat cat. And remember, I am

a messenger of God. No matter where I go, the Lord

is right by my side takin' care of business.

Townsperson 1: But, how can a God in heaven help you with the

powerful King Ahab?

Townsperson 2: King Ahab is really scary. But not near as scary as his

evil wife, Jezebel. They are a dastardly duo.

Townsperson 3: (holds hands up as if growling) Growl...Ready for the

attack.

Elijah: Hang loose, Iraelites. Don't worry about King and

Queen Nightmare. God will take care of them. You need to worry about what you're doing. You've so got

to get with the program.

Townsperson 4: Program, what do you mean?

Elijah: Bad things happen to folks when they start believin'

that things in this world will solve their problems. Baal...money...work...you know, false gods...you get

the picture?

Townsperson 1: Not yet, but go on.

Elijah: You don't see answers 'cause you're lookin' down the

wrong road. You've got to get your chariot on the right track and stop worryin' about pleasin' that king and queen. I totally dig that you're scared, but you gotta start worryin' about pleasin' God. Then, let God take

care of business.

Townsperson 2: Right, ok, we've heard that before.

Townsperson 3: And look at us...here we are living under the rule of

King Terrible and Queen Horrible.

Elijah: Dudes, I totally get your vibe. But God is so much

more powerful. He can totally deal with King A and

Queen J. You just have to trust him.

Townsperson 4: We want to trust him, Elijah...but we just don't have

the strength to trust anymore. It is easier just to give

into the pressures of this world than fight.

Elijah: Ok, we have got to get some God power right here,

right now. You dudes have to remember to focus on these cool vibes. "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight." Come on, let's rev it up a little. Everybody,

Scene 3 CD: 7

Townsperson 1: Elijah, we're so thankful that you have come to help

us.

Townsperson 2: Yes, we have been mixed up.

Townsperson 3: Thanks for setting us straight. You rock.

Elijah: (Elvis style) Ah, Thank ya, thank ya very much.

Townsperson 4: We'll try to trust in God.

Elijah: You all just need to totally tune in to what this old

prophet is tellin' you 'cause the next few years are not gonna be easy. God's about to deal with King A and Queen J and I will be His messenger to give that

dastardly duo the bad news.

Townsperson 1: Be careful, Elijah.

Townsperson 2: Yes, dealing with King Ahab can be hazardous to

your health.

Elijah: I totally dig it. I see where you're at. I just know that

this is my gig, to bring the people of Israel back to

God.

Townsperson 3: Good luck, Elijah.

Townsperson 4: You'll need it.

Elijah: Thanks, folks. A man's gotta do what a man's

gotta do. I'm off to meet King A and Queen J.

(Elijah exits)

(Stage right King Ahab and Queen Jezebel enter and sit on their thrown.)

Jezebel: I'm bored.

King Ahab: I cannot believe you are bored with all your riches

and jewels...how can you be bored?

Jezebel: I don't know. I just know that I'm bored.

King Ahab: You are never happy, Jezebel. Never. Maybe you

should go pray to your god, Baal.

Jezebel: That never helps. No matter how much I pray I still

feel empty and bored. There's just nothing to do. (Whining) No one to persecute. Life in this kingdom

has gotten soooo boooooring.

(Obadiah enters)

Obadiah: King Ahab, you have a visitor...His name is Elijah.

He says he is a prophet of the Almighty God.

Jezebel: This might be interesting, Ahab. Let's hear what

he has to say.

King Ahab: All right, send him to me.

Obadiah: (Shouting) King Ahab! I present to you Elijah, the

prophet of the Almighty God.

(Elijah enters)

Elijah: Greetings to you King Ahab, dude.

King Ahab: A prophet of God...Jezebel I thought we ran all those

prophets out of town.

Jezebel: I guess I missed one. But, let's listen to him, Ahab. At

least I am not bored anymore.

Elijah: King A and Queen J, I've been sent to jam with you

royals and lay a message on you from my Lord, the

one and only Almighty God.

Jezebel: Oh, goody. I love secrets.

Elijah: Queen J, this is no secret. In fact, your Queendom,

I'm here to lay this on you, King A and all of Israel.

King Ahab: Oh really, so what is your message, Elijah. What

would your God have to say to me, the mighty King

Ahab?

Elijah: Dude, you've been worshippin' that pile of iron over

there instead of the one true God. King A and Queen J, I'm here to tell you to turn from your evil ways. Stop

worshippin' the false gods and follow the Lord.

King Ahab: You don't need to speak of your Almighty God here.

I'm the only mighty one around here. What can your

God do to help me, the Mighty King Ahab?

Jezebel: I think you just need to turn around and leave. I'm

bored with you, Elijah.

Elijah: I'll leave, but only after I tell you what's up, King A

and Queen J.

King Ahab: What more could you possibly have to say that would

interest me?

Jezebel: Yes, what secret do you need to tell us? By the way,

Obadiah, I would like a glass water from the well. I'm

parched.

Obadiah: There is no water, Queen. There is no water

anywhere.

Jezebel: What? There must be water. Go! Go! I need a drink

right now.

Elijah: Well, ma'am, I hate to tell ya, but your butler there is

right. There's no water. And because you haven't worshipped the one true God, I'm afraid you won't be

needin' an umbrella for quite a spell.

King Ahab: What do you mean? There must be water. Only this

afternoon I saw rain clouds in the distant sky.

Obadiah: The sky is clear now, King Ahab. Not a cloud in the

sky.

King Ahab: (To the courtier) Seize him! Seize Elijah! You will not

do this to us!

(Elijah runs off stage.)

Obadiah: He got away, King.

King Ahab: Never mind, Obadiah. I'm so thirsty. I can't believe all

the water is gone.

Jezebel: Look, here's my bottled water from this morning. (She

drinks the water in front of King Ahab.) Ahhhhh, good.

King Ahab: How about a sip for the king?

Jezebel: Sorry. It's all gone.

(King Ahab and Jezebel exit the stage. Elijah runs in and stands in front of the cave.)

Elijah: Man, that was close. Hey, look, here is a cool hideout.

I'll be safe here in this cave. This brook will keep this dude in water, but I'm so hungry. How will I eat? Wait! God always takes care of the big E man. I will just trust him once again. Look at those birds! They have

bread and meat.

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Scene 5 CD: 11

(King Ahab and Queen Jezebel enter to sit in their thrones. Obadiah is standing stage right. Elijah joins Obadiah.)

Elijah: Greetings, O-man. Obadiah, how's it been going?

Obadiah: Not so great, Elijah. Everyone in Israel is suffering. No

rain has been hard on the crops so there is little food.

Life is not good.

Elijah: Well, guess what, dude? God has given me another

message to share with King A. Will you tell him I'm

here?

Obadiah: Elijah, if I mention your name he will kill me for just

knowing you. But, I will do as you ask because I know

that God will be with me.

Elijah: Thank you, O-man. You rock.

King Ahab: I am soooooo thirsty.

Jezebel: Who cares about you? Look at my hair. It hasn't been

washed and styled for over a year.

King Ahab: It is your fault Jezebel. You and your silly idol.

Jezebel: My idol is not silly.

King Ahab: Is too!

Jezebel: Is not!

King Ahab: Is too!

Jezebel: Is not!

King Ahab: Is too!

Jezebel: Is not!

Obadiah: (Clears his throat) King Ahab, Elijah, the prophet is

here to bring you news.

King Ahab: (Surprised) Elijah, here?

Obadiah: He says he's received a message from God. He says

he *must* speak with you.

King Ahab: Bring him to me. Finally, maybe an end to this

drought.

Jezebel: And I can get my hair washed and styled.

Obadiah: (Goes get Elijah) (Shouting) King Ahab, I present to

you, Elijah the prophet.

King Ahab: I'm surprised to see you, Elijah.

Elijah: Hey King A and Queen J! What's up? Been enjoyin'

the dry spell?

Jezebel: No, we have not enjoyed the "dry spell." In fact, I—we

have been simply miserable. Just look at my hair! I'm

a mess!

King Ahab: Get to the point, Elijah. I am not a happy king...and

everyone knows around here they need to keep me

happy.

Elijah: I have another message for you from the Man

Upstairs.

King Ahab: Hopefully a weather forecast stating 100% chance of

rain?

Elijah: No puddles yet King A, but definitely a challenge...a

challenge sent from the Almighty God.

King Ahab: A challenge. We don't need a challenge. We need

rain!

Elijah: I, Elijah, the prophet of God would like to duke it out

with the prophets of Baal.

King Ahab: I'm listening.

Elijah: Okay, here's how it will all go down. The Lord God

has a construction project for us to do. He wants your prophets to build an alter to their Baal dude and I'll build mine to my One and Only, the Almighty God.

King Ahab: Okay, I'm liking it.

Elijah: After we're finished with the cool construction, we'll

each bring a sacrifice to offer to our gods...sort of like

a cool barbeque.

King Ahab: I'm loving it.

Jezebel: I love cooking out. It's so domestic. Obadiah, get your

apron.

Elijah: There's only one catch, King A. We can't light our

fires.

King Ahab: So how can you make a sacrifice without a fire?

Jezebel: Everyone knows that a barbeque has to have a fire.

Elijah, you obviously are not a gourmet cook.

Elijah: Queen J, you will pray to Baal to "light your fire" and

I will do some heavy praying to my Lord to light mine.

King Ahab: Go on...

Elijah: And, the God that lights their alter fire will prove that

He is totally, awesomely, undoubtedly the One and Only true and Mighty God. What a rockin' challenge!

Jezebel: I like this challenge, Elijah. Of course, my god will win.

Elijah: We'll see...we'll see.

King Ahab: Let the games begin.

Obadiah: Baal prophets you may build your altar.

(The Baal prophets bring in their wood and create their altar.)

Baal Prophet 1: We are finished.

King Ahab: Very good work, prophets. Elijah, let's see if you can

top that fine presentation.

Obadiah: Elijah, you may begin.

Elijah: Sticks! Cool. These sticks will totally dominate as the

altar! (He piles sticks on the ground.) (To Obadiah who has a shovel) Dude, I am so needin' that shovel. (Elijah pretends to dig a trench around the alter)

Jezebel: What a waste of time...digging a trench around the

altar.

Elijah: Man, I want this altar to rock so I need those twelve

stones. (Elijah points to the stones) And to make this alter totally cool, I will need to pour twelve jars of

water into the trench.

Obadiah: (Obadiah points to the stones) Here are some stones.

And I'll have the townspeople bring you the water.

Elijah: Cool, Obadiah. Man you rock.

Jezebel: Why would you need twelve stones? I thought you

were trying to make a fire, not a backyard barbecue

grill.

Elijah: Hey, Queen J, I'm making the altar like the Lord told

me to make it. I always do what the man upstairs tells

me to do.

Jezebel: That's the problem with your God. He is always telling

people what to do. AND people like me do not like

that. My god is quiet.

Elijah: If only you could get it! Obeyin's cool. Doin' what the

Lord wants you to do will bring you joy, Queen J. And

I am so not seein' joy on your face.

Jezebel: (Pretends to grin) Oh, really, look again.

Elijah: Yikes, still not seein' it. Still no joy, Queen J.

King Ahab: Why do you need twelve stones?

Elijah: Dude, to remind me of my family. You know I'm a part

of the family of Israel, you know the twelve tribes. But what really rocks is that I'm a part of an even bigger family...the family of God. Man, I just can't praise God

enough for letting me be his child. I think that's coolest part about Him...He's my best friend.

Elijah: Maybe this Baal dude is on vacation.

wrong.

Jezebel: You all are lousy prophets...that's the problem.

Townsperson 4: Maybe forty days and forty nights!


Elijah: No, that's another story. Won't you come and know




Elijah knew God would destroy them if they did not turn away from their sin. But, the people would not listen and Elijah went into hiding as a long drought came upon the land.
